COVID-19 FOOD

Food banks, government benefits, and local programs offer emergency food and other basic needs during the pandemic.



EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Job search planning, resume development, interview coaching, job lead databases and re-training programs.



COVID-19 FINANCIAL

Information about unemployment benefits, small business assistance, loans and grants, and saving money.



FINANCIAL COUNSELING

Non-profit Credit, Bankruptcy, and Budget counseling as well as in-person and online financial education.



COVID-19 HEALTH

Reliable information about health safety, testing, and getting health care during the pandemic.



HEALTH INSURANCE

Direct connection to affordable care exchanges and navigators who can help understand healthcare options, apply for coverage and enroll.



CHILD CARE

Referrals to affordable and high-quality child care programs in your local community.



HEALTHCARE SAVINGS

Clinics and grants for the uninsured and under-insured that provide primary care, optical care, dental care, and disease management help.



DISASTER RELIEF

After a federally declared disaster, help finding emergency food and shelter as well as resources to rebuild and financially recover.



HEATING & UTILITY COSTS

Financial assistance with gas, oil, electric, water and other utilities, as well as weatherization.



DOWN PAYMENT ASSISTANCE

Down payment and closing costs grants and loans for prospective homebuyers.



HOME REPAIR

Local grant and loan programs help repair your home.



IMMIGRATION SUPPORT

Legal representation and filing assistance for asylum seekers, refugees, and newcomers changing immigration status.



NATIONAL RESOURCES

If there are limited local options, these national tip sheets, hotlines and websites provide info, assistance and then referrals.



INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

Free assistance with preparation and filing of income taxes.



PRESCRIPTION SAVINGS

Free programs that reduce the costs of prescription medications, some offered by the drug companies, others by state and public agencies.



LEGAL SERVICES

Legal assistance and advice for qualified persons in civil cases including family law, public benefits, healthcare, and other areas.



PROPERTY TAX ISSUES

Local agencies that help to review property tax bills for errors or reassessments and assists with the filing of exemptions.



MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Individual and family counseling and behavioral support services.



RENTAL RESOURCES

Web-based tools that connect renters to safe, affordable housing or rental counseling in their area.



MILITARY RESOURCES

Wide-ranging assistance specifically for active duty service members, veterans, and their families.



SENIOR CITIZEN SERVICES

Non-profits provide case management and referrals to local providers, including respite care, day programs, transportation, in-home care and nutrition.



MORTGAGE COUNSELING

HUD-certified counseling agencies provide options to homeowners who are struggling to afford their mortgage.



STUDENT LOAN COUNSELING

Local non-profit counselors explore all options to help repay student loans.

FAIR HOUSING

Organizations that process and investigate housing discrimination complaints.
